The Southern Australia Livestock Research Council (SALRC) is offering five scholarships up to the value of \$750 each for young researcher or extension professionals from our 19 investor member organisations. Winners will attend and present at the upcoming SALRC Council meeting in Wagga on Tuesday 10th October 2023. Winners will also have the opportunity to attend the Digital Agrifood-Summit, taking place in Wagga following the Council meeting on 11-12 October.

SALRC understands the importance of supporting and mentoring early career professionals. The SALRC Council meeting offers young researchers and extension professionals an opportunity to showcase their research / extension activities and network with leading producers, researchers and extension professionals from the southern Australian livestock industry.

The Competition

To enter submit a short 3-5 minute video detailing your research project or extension activity by **5:00pm (AEST) Friday 15th September 2023**. Successful applicants will win a \$750 scholarship to attend and present their research / extension activities to the SALRC Council at their meeting in Wagga on Tuesday 10th October 2023 and will also have access to online training with a presentation specialist prior to the meeting. Successful applicants will be notified by **Friday 22nd September 2023**.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to apply for a scholarship you must be:

- Under the age of 35
- Employed by one of SALRC's 19 investor member / affiliate organisations
- Undertaking research or extension work relevant to the southern Australian red meat livestock industries
- Able to attend and present at the SALRC Council meeting in Wagga on Tuesday 10th October 2023

Media and Promotions

Winning videos will be shared with our seven livestock producer regional committees to encourage networking and allow for a greater understanding of research happening that directly impacts our regions.



Video Content

Researcher videos should include:

- · A short description of the aims of the research and the outcomes it hopes to achieve
- How the research will be adopted on farm and impacts producers can expect to see?
- Alignment with <u>SALRC R,D or A priorities</u> (if any)

Extension videos should include:

- A short description of the aims of the extension activity and the outcomes it hopes to achieve
- What makes a good PDS / extension activity and what leads to good adoption by producers?
- Alignment with <u>SALRC PDS priorities</u> (if any)

Note: Submissions detailing research or extension projects that are related to a SALRC priority will be considered favorably.
